




## Chore chart, example 1

Print and laminate the resource, you can then use a whiteboard marker to write in chores for each day, if appropriate you can add monetary value to each day. If the chore is complete the money stays on the chart, if not the money is removed, the chart is then 'cashed in' at the end of the week. If money is not appropriate simply tick the day if chores are completed and this can be traded in for a reward at the end of the week e.g. pick the dinner night.

in the chores listed or write your own with a whiteboard marker. When the child completes the chore they can pick a token for their chart, if chore isn't completed leave blank, by the end of the week you can count the points/ tokens. Full points would hold a higher value compared to getting 10 points, you can decide the rewards.
